7.2.1. Library Service Index: Please see the attached performance report.

7.2.2. Key Statistics: Our total library membership has improved to 9852 which is approximately 29% more than the same time last year. In May, we had 16,239 library visits and circulated 23,828 materials. Patrons used an additional 1,868 materials within the library during the month. There were 4,580 uses of technology. Our online outreach totaled 25,330. The library provided information assistance 2,116 times. We are pleased to see that our service statistics continue to increase. **7.2.3. Staff Anniversaries:** We extend congratulations to Maria Bertrand and Diana Zarzosa on their work anniversaries. We thank them for contributing their time, effort, skills and talents!

7.2.4. Summer Student Positions: We are excited to announce that Grace Pellizzer and Laura Yeo have joined the library staff for the summer. They will be helping with programs both in the building and the community.

7.2.5. Entrance to the TOM: The completion of the TOM's accessibility project has been temporarily delayed while they wait for some pieces to be manufactured. The project will extend further into the summer.

7.2.6. Andrew Armitage Memorial Bench: We thank the City of Owen Sound for their help with this project. The bench has been installed at the front of the library. The inscription on accompanying plaque reads:

Andrew Armitage 2/13/1939 - 11/18/2021 Chief Librarian 1974 - 2000 Bench donated in memory of our beloved friend, colleague, mentor, librarian, author, historian, book reviewer, canoeist, nature lover, prolific reader, and The Georgian Bay Explorer. "What are you reading?

7.2.7. Book Vending Machine Project: We have begun discussions with staff at Georgian Bluffs and Chatsworth about possible locations for our book vending machines. We will be working over the summer on the project details with the plan to launch community library stations in the fall. The stations will include a book vending machine that is accessed by using our library card, a book drop for materials to be returned and a screen displaying library programs and services.
7.2.8. Borrow a Laptop: Beginning in June, library members will be able to borrow a laptop for in-Library use. Our desktop computers will be retired and replaced with this new service.

7.2.9. Owen Sound Camera Club Photography Show: The Library is pleased to welcome the Owen Sound Camera Club for their photography show, *Just Birds!* As one of the oldest camera clubs in Ontario, they have been meeting to share their love of photography for 67 years! Stop by to experience the abundant talent this group has to offer. The exhibit runs until August.

7.2.11. Pollinator Symposium: On Saturday, June 10 the OPEN Team hosted a Pollinator Symposium at the Art Gallery which included talks by prominent local master gardeners as well as the Curator of the exhibition 'Undergrowth' - as featured in the spring edition of <u>Escarpment Magazine</u>. 7.2.12. River District Blooms: At the Pollinator Symposium, Both Pollinate Owen Sound and the River District Blooms projects were launched. The OPEN Team worked together to create one of the River District Blooms installations. While the current plants used, will be repurposed and replanted in the gardens the library, art gallery and museums, we are working with the City of Owen Sound to see if Tom's Plant Portage can be a more permanent installation.

7.2.13. TD Summer Reading Club: All youth (birth to grade 12) can register in Youth Services beginning Saturday, June 24 or any time through the summer. When they register, they will receive their own tracking notebook and they can

make a special Summer Reading button. They can track the books they read and show us what they've read when they next visit the Library. Then roll the big dice to play our giant board game for the chance to win an end of summer prize!

7.2.14. Summer Reading Bingo: Library patrons can grab a Summer Reading Bingo card and complete all the challenges by the end of summer. Each BINGO (one row, column or diagonal line) earns a ballot for the monthly draw. A full card enters the participant into the bonus draw at the end of summer!

7.2.15. StoryWalk: We have launched this year's StoryWalk program at Queen's Park, across from the library. June will showcase "Amik" by Sharon King. In July and August enjoy "Treasure" by Mireille Messier. And In September read "Keeshig and the Ojibwe Pterodactyls" by Keeshig Spade and Celeste Pedri-Spade. Both "Amik" and "Keeshig and the Ojibwe Pterodactyls" were created in partnership with Kegedonce Press. The Kegedonce Press StoryWalks can be borrowed by other organizations.

7.2.16. Art Walk: On Saturday June 24 from 10:00 am until 4:00 pm, the Library will be a stop on the 2023 ArtWalk, organized by the Ginger Press. See if you can find the "Art Star" as part of the community-wide scavenger hunt. Throughout the day visit Youth Services to add a little bit of colour to our TD Summer Reading Club mural that will decorate the department all summer long. From 10:00 am - 12:00 pm there will also be a drop-in, come-and-go still life sketching circle for all ages on the Main Level.
